Principals Message

Dear Families,

Welcome back to Term 3 and I hope your children had a restful winter holiday break.

Term 3 is another busy term and also the coldest weather of the year.

Please make sure that your child is dressed appropriately for the wet and wintery weather.

So many children are wearing shorts and short sleeves and complaining that they are cold. The office can help with some uniform relief for those who have not already requested support and who met the criteria. Please reach out if you need support for uniforms.

A reminder that we have standards for our uniform and leggings, hoodies, black jumpers ARE NOT acceptable uniform. We will be having a uniform blitz next week and any child out of uniform will receive a gentle reminder to dress in the correct uniform every day.

We implement high standards of our uniforms to ensure students experience and learn that rules are important and keep us safe. It is important that we teach our students so when they encounter rules and expectations in their lives, they understand the need to follow them. Good uniform expectations and rules support this work. It also teaches them respect. I know that all our families would agree that respect and following rules are important lifelong lessons.








Teaching and Learning News

Students are loving attending the library once a week to browse and borrow books. A friendly reminder that students need a library bag in order to borrow. This keeps our beautiful books safe from being damaged in school bags. Unfortunately, the QPS reader bags are not big enough to hold most of our picture books and non-fiction texts which are proving to be really popular for borrowing. Therefore some sort of library bag is compulsory please.

This term we are beginning to send home letters for any overdue or damaged books. As you can imagine take-home readers and library books are very expensive. When these books come back damaged or go missing it can end up costing the school a lot of extra money.


NAIDOC WEEK 2024


































Brainstorm Incursion
