Principals Message

Dear Families,

I hope you are enjoying this warmer weather.

This is a friendly reminder to our family and community that smoking and vaping are banned on school sites and within 4 metres of any entry point (gates).

This can be found on the DET website:

School smoking and vaping ban

The Tobacco Act 1987 (Vic) bans smoking and vaping on school premises, and within 4 metres of any pedestrian access point to school premises. This applies to anyone on school premises during and outside of school hours including students, staff and school visitors.

The department also bans smoking and vaping at school events and excursions held off school premises.

Recently we have received increasing complaints from families regarding inappropriate social media use of students outside of school hours, particularly in our Gr 3-6 area.

It is important to understand that, as a school, we engage the students in learning experiences on a regular basis regarding safe and appropriate internet use.

However, in the family home, it is the responsibility of parents to monitor and know exactly what social media is being used and how their child/ren is using social media.

Some of the incidents are of very mean and unkind posts and comments against classmates.

The school does not condone this behaviour and will at all times strongly encourage families to report to the relevant authorities if necessary, e.g., police or DFFH.

We are happy for parents to inform us if there is an incident so we can alert those involved in the behaviour.

However, we need parents to parent their child when and if an incident arises with a suitable follow up.

Please remind your children that using the school logo or any images from our Facebook page to upload to your own pages or YouTube channel is inappropriate and against the purpose of our Facebook page.

It is also inappropriate to identify any child other than your child on social media or for any of our students to identify another student at QPS on social media.

Our Facebook page is a celebration of our students' achievements and sharing of information.

From now on, our Facebook page will only be to provide information, and we will not be sharing photos of any events until we are confident that our community will use our information and posts appropriately.

We will also not be allowing any photos or video at our assemblies or upcoming concert.


As a school, we need to protect the privacy of all and act accordingly following the recent increase in misuse of social media by some of our students outside of school hours.

National Day of Action Against Bullying is now called 'Bullying No Way'. As part of this week, we will be recognising its importance particularly on Friday 16 August.


The theme for 2024 is 'Everyone belongs'.




Specialist News
