#### **Teaching and Learning News**

#### What Happens at QPS When a Teacher

#### is Away?



There are many staff absences at the moment, which we are managing

across the whole school.

There have been many students and teachers who have needed to stay at home unwell. When a teacher is away, we will often try and get a Casual Relief Teacher (CRT) to teach the grade for the day. Presently however, there is a huge shortage of casual relief teachers and we are unable to secure a CRT even when booking in advance. This means we are not able to replace absent QPS teachers because the agencies are unable to provide CRTs.

When we are unable to replace teachers with a CRT the grade is split into other grades throughout the school. Depending on the number of grades being split on the day, there are several different ways this can be done, students may be:

- Split amongst grades of their own year level students will join in and do the same work as the grade they are split into. Our teams collaboratively plan so they will usually be learning what they would be in their own grade. They will attend specialists with the grade they are split into (unless they have a specialist at the same time), so they may end up attending a particular specialist more than once in the week.
- 2. Split amongst a different year level students will have a 'Split Grid' with activities for them to do throughout the day. These grids are created by the teachers and include a reading, writing and numeracy activity as well as other curriculum areas. These grids are updated as students use them. They will attend specialists with the grade they are split into (unless they have a specialist at the same time), so they may end up attending a particular specialist more than once in the week.
- 3. Split across the whole school students will have a 'Split Grid' with activities for them to do throughout the day. These grids are created by the teachers and include a reading, writing and numeracy activity as well as other curriculum areas. These grids are updated as students use them. They will attend specialists with the grade they are split into (unless they have a specialist at the same time), so they may end up attending a particular specialist more than once in the week.

If a specialist teacher is away (P.E, Art, Auslan or Digi Tech) and we are unable to replace them with a CRT, then that particular program may not run for that day.

Any Intervention, Occupational Therapy or Speech Program will run as per the usual timetable and any student in split grades will not miss out on attending these programs



#### R U OK? Day - Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> September



Fathers and Families Breakfast 🤗



#### **Community News**

Dear parents and carers,

In Term 4, 2024, families with a child enrolled in a government school from Prep to Year 12 in 2025 will receive the one-off \$400 School Saving Bonus.

The \$400 School Saving Bonus provides families with support for education-related costs, such as school activities and/or school uniforms and textbooks.

The School Saving Bonus is not available for full-fee international students, home schooled students, TAFE students and students attending kindergarten in 2025.

#### Actions for parents and carers

Before 18 October 2024, the Department of Education is asking parents and carers to:

- **Complete enrolment:** If your child, or children are changing government school for Term 1 2025, or starting Prep or Year 7 in 2025. For more information, read about <u>Enrolling in School</u>.
- **Check your contact information:** Ensure your email address and phone number is up to date with us by completing the School Saving Bonus Activity on the parent Sentral App before the 18<sup>th</sup> of October.

We need to ensure your contact information is up to date as the Department of Education will email you twice:

- in October, to verify your email address
- in November, with your \$400 School Saving Bonus.

Please check your junk mail regularly to make sure you do not miss an important email.

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# SUPPORT YOUR CHILD'S EDUCATION WITH FREE INTERNET AT HOME UNTIL DECEMBER 2025

The School Student Broadband Initiative (SSBI) is a Federal Government initiative offering free home internet to 30,000 unconnected households with school-aged students. Households have until **Tuesday 31 December 2024** to apply. Free services will continue until 31 December 2025.

The initiative seeks to boost educational opportunities and narrow the digital divide.

To be eligible, households must:

- have a child living at home that is enrolled in an Australian school (up to year 12 including Prep)
- not have an active NBN Co. network internet service at home (excludes mobile internet services)
- live in a premises that can access the NBN Co. network via a standard connection
- not have had an active NBN Co. connection during the previous 14 days.

To be assessed, please contact the NBN National Referral Centre on **1800 954 610** or visit <u>anglicarevic.org.au/student-internet</u> to request a call back. Please note:

- NBN will check your nominated home address for an active NBN connection.
- You do not need to provide financial information.
- Translation and interpretation services are available.

Some families might also be contacted via their school with information about how to apply. The Victorian Department of Education has been working with the NBN to review Victorian school student home addresses. Only home addresses have been provided to NBN to check. No other personal information has been shared with NBN. NBN handles this data in accordance with privacy law.
