Dear Families,

City of Casey Road Safety Forum

On Wednesday, Trish McColley (School Council President) and myself attended the City of Casey Road Safety Forum at Bunjil Place. The City of Casey received a grant to support their Safe Around Schools (SAS) program. The speakers explained what the program offers to support safety around schools. The City of Casey provides the school crossings. School crossing supervisors are authorised to manage traffic. Teachers are not authorised to do this. If a school crossing supervisor is absent, teachers are not authorised to stop traffic to allow students to use the crossing. What they can do is the same as any adult, support students to cross the road when it is safe to do so in a group.



City of Casey has 102 schools and they manage 165 crossings. They have specific criteria that needs to be met for a school crossing to be considered. For a primary school, there needs to be a minimum of 20 children use the crossing and 100 vehicles per hour. This is why no crossings along the Central Parkway or Colchester Ave are in place because criteria has not been met. Once the industrial areas are operational from QPS to Westernport Highway, we may see an increase in vehicle usage to support another crossing.

In the City of Casey, there are more than 420,000 school trips per week, because we have 102 schools with over 70,000 students and more than 42,000 families. That's a lot of traffic around our schools. SAS encourages active travel options– such as bikes, scooters, walking or carpool.

- Not understanding local parking signs
- Not following local and state road rules
- Speeding
- Double parking
- Parking across driveways
- Not wearing seatbelts
- Doing U-turns inappropriately



BOGGLE

A **4×4** formation of letters. A 3-minute timer is started and all players search for words that fit the following criteria:

Words must be at least three letters in length.

• Each letter chosen must be a horizontal, vertical, or diagonal neighbour of the one before it.

• No individual letter cube may be used more than once in a word.

Multiple forms of the same word are allowed, such as singular and

plural forms. Each player records all the words they find by writing on a sheet of paper. After three minutes have elapsed, all players must immediately stop writing.

In this, each player reads off their list of discovered words. If two or more players wrote the same word, it is removed from all players' lists. Once all duplicates and invalid words have been eliminated, points are awarded based on the length of each remaining word in a player's list. The winner is the player whose point total is highest, with any ties typically broken by a count of long words.

The number of points you earn depends on the length of the word:

- 3-letter words and 4-letter words are 1 point each.
- 5-letter words are 2 points each.
- 6-letter words are 3 points each.
- 7-letter words are 5 points each.
- 8-letter words and longer are 11 points each.

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
