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## Principals Message

Dear Families,

Time to plan ahead!

I respect that we may not be wanting to think about 2026 yet, but we are beginning to look at our enrolment numbers and whole school structure.

If you know you won't be at QPS in 2026, please let us know by email or call the office. This information is vital for the school to budget and plan for staffing in 2026. We don't want any children to be in classrooms that have too many students or only have a few students in them, this relies on us knowing who will be at QPS next year.



If you know any family or friends who want to attend QPS for the first time in 2026, but haven't yet enrolled, please encourage them to do so ASAP by contacting the office.

### IMPORTANT:

**If you know your child will not be starting school on the 27<sup>th</sup> of January 2026** because you are overseas or on holiday, you must fill in the long absence form with the proposed return date of attendance. Government schools are funded on their enrolments and if we can't prove your child is enrolled, this may impact our funding. By filling in the form, this is evidence that your child will be returning to school after school has started.

**For those taking a holiday over the summer break**, I encourage you to have your child back so they can start school on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> January for grades 1-6 and Preps on Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> January. Every day is important and particularly settling into a new school year with their class together is the best way to start the school year. Starting later due to a holiday means the child has missed important routines and getting to know each other and their teacher.

## Sharing some positives about QPS.

**Students in grade 4 -6 are surveyed as part of the DET's Attitudes to School Survey.** I am pleased to say that QPS had a 100% (perfect) response rate. That means our students all had the opportunity for their voice to be heard.

The inclusion and wellbeing team, Mrs Mitchell, Mrs Sanghani and Mrs Vella, have conducted focus groups with our years 4-6 students to find out what we are doing well and what we can do better. Our students are quite articulate and are comfortable to tell us what they think – but always politely.

Overall, we are very pleased with our results but understand we have a few areas to focus on.

On the managing bullying – our students have voted and 92% say we manage it well. That's great validation coming from our students. The work covered in our SEL program is having such positive impacts! Well done QPS!

There are many results, but some key areas were:

Managing Bullying	92%
Effective Classroom Behaviour	93%
Motivation and Interest	93%
Self-regulation and Goal Setting	96%

Sense of Connectedness	87%

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## Teaching and Learning News


### FRACTIONS FUN!

Year 3/4s have been developing their skills in the understanding and application of Fractions. They have been learning to make, name, record, compare, order and sequence fractions. They have also been developing their knowledge of equivalent Fractions in the halving, thirding and fifthing families. Fractions are a difficult concept to learn so learners have been paper folding and using hands on resources such as the Lego seen in these pictures to really develop a visual understanding.

There are lots of ways to support learning fractions at home but cooking is a fantastic way to develop the understanding of fractions and particularly equivalence. Here are some questions to ask when cooking...

- The recipe asks for 1 1/2 cups of flour -
  - If I only have the 1/2 cup to use how many of these do I need for the flour in the recipe?
  - If I only have the 1/4 cup to use how many of these do I need for the flour in the recipe?
  - If I only have the 1/8 cup to use how many of these do I need for the flour in the recipe?
- Getting them to cook recipes and use the different measuring cups and spoons for ingredients is a great activity with rich links to mathematics.


Day for Daniel aims to:

### Punctuality Matters!

**Missed minutes = missed learning = missed opportunities**

At Quarters Primary School, we know that arriving on time each day helps set students up for success. Being punctual ensures that children start the day calmly, join in morning routines, and don't miss valuable learning time.

Our school day begins promptly at **8:50 a.m.**, and all learners are expected to be in their classrooms, ready to begin learning at this time. Students arriving after 9:00 a.m. will be marked as **present but late**.

### Why Attendance and Punctuality Matter

Regular and punctual attendance lays the foundation for a child's academic achievement, social development, and emotional wellbeing. Missing even small amounts of learning time can quickly add up, affecting progress and confidence.

Students with attendance below **90%** are considered **persistent absentees**, which can have a lasting impact on their learning outcomes.

### What Our Data Shows

In the first two weeks of **Term 4**, **62 students** arrived **15–20 minutes late** to school. This adds up to a significant amount of lost learning time for both individuals and classes.

### How We're Supporting Our Learners

We're continuing to:

- Monitor attendance and punctuality closely.
- Work with families to identify and overcome barriers to arriving on time.
- Remind students about the importance of punctuality and being ready to learn.

Together, we can make every minute of learning count. Thank you for your ongoing support in helping your child arrive on time and ready for a great day of learning at QPS!



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
